Pioneer of the Year Award Winner Ian Shaw



lan Shaw is a motion picture industry veteran having spent the past 39 years in the business.

Beginning his career while still at high school in 1977, he held two roles — one as an usher at the Hyland Theatre in Oshawa and the other at the concession counter at the Odeon Bay Ridges Drive-in - located in nearby Pickering, Ontario. At the drive-in, he was quickly promoted to "ramp boy," catching all the guys who tried to sneak in without paying! Bay Ridges was known as Canada's first all-electric outdoor theatre and opened on December 21, 1962 with a double feature that included Carry on Cruising and John Ford's Two Rode Together.

lan continued working two jobs after high school

one as theatre manager working evenings at the original Cineplex Odeon Fairview Mall Cinemas, located on Sheppard Avenue in Toronto, Ontario and the other - by day — part-time in the mailroom at Canadian Odeon's home office. In 1980, lan moved to Odeon's head office as a full-time shipper-receiver and continued his double duties by taking business and procurement management courses at night at both Ryerson University and Centennial College. Working his way up through the ranks, lan was promoted several times over the years and in 2003, was promoted to Vice President, Purchasing, Supply Management and Facilities at Cineplex Entertainment.

During his career, the logo on his paycheck may have changed many times but his commitment to the industry never wavered. Over the years, lan has quietly but effectively implemented many philanthropic efforts on behalf of Cineplex including building and retrofitting screening rooms and auditoriums at the Hospital for Sick Children (Toronto), Mount Sinai Hospital (Toronto), IWK Children's Hospital (Halifax), Soldiers Screening Room (Tel Aviv, Israel), and at the University of Toronto's Town Hall and Innis College where they honoured lan with the Arbour Award for all of his work.


Six companies and 13 bosses in 39 years -Odeon Theatres of Canada - Canadian Odeon Theatres – Cineplex Corporation - Cineplex Odeon Corporation - Cineplex Galaxy Income Fund — culminating at Cineplex Entertainment.

His colleagues would say that "lan is known for being the one who always gets everything done - no matter how large or complex the project and without any fanfare. He has also been instrumental in making Cineplex more environmentally aware and responsive long before it was fashionable." Ian led the conversion of disposable bags, cups and paper products used by Cineplex to forest friendly and recycled materials. Other environmental projects included lighting conversions in theatres and at Home and regional offices to limit energy consumption, electronics recycling and fibre board recycling.

In 1980, Ian began his longtime support of the Canadian Picture Pioneers, well ahead of becoming a member in 1993, and joining the board of directors in 2009. Ian has always respond to the call to action to support Pioneer events whether it be for picnics, golf tournaments or holiday parties. Sponsors have always responded kindly to Ian's endless requests for support to benefit the Pioneers. He has also been a long-term member of Cineplex's Donations Committee where he has supported numerous charitable and fundraising initiatives — most recently to benefit Starlight Children's Foundation, Free the Children and Food Banks Canada.

However, of all his numerous accomplishments, he is most proud, and rightly so, of his 25 year old son Michael.




Diamond Spotlight Award Winner

During the summer of 1989, I received a call from Norman Stern asking if I would consider coming to work for him. Norman and his partner, Peter Sorok, were the owners of Ontario Theatre Group which, along with Ontario Cinemas and PNS Realty, operated several theatres in small Ontario towns as well as the Mt. Pleasant and Regent theatres in Toronto. As luck would have it, I was working part-time for an engineering company in Brampton and looking to move to full-time employment. As soon as I saw the OTG offices located in a little semi-detached house on Mt. Pleasant Ave, I was sold! Like most people, I have always loved movies and was eager to join this exciting industry. I loved the company as well as the environment and over the years, formed close friendships with my co-workers. In addition to accounting, payroll, and property management, my responsibilities included faxing weekly bookings, reporting grosses, liaising with the theatres on everything and anything, packing and distributing various exhibitor materials as well as folding, cataloguing and filing hundreds of movie posters. Eventually I also became Norman's booking assistant and realized that this was the job I really wanted to do, even though in those days I had to learn to tolerate some pretty strong language. And so began my career as a film programmer. After 10 years with OTG, I was finally able to join the Canadian Picture Pioneers and truly felt that I was part of the film community.

In 1999, Ellis Jacob and Steve Brown purchased Ontario Theatre Group as the basis for a new company with a mandate to bring state of the art movie theatres to small communities. I was delighted and proud to be a member of the original Galaxy team that helped make Ellis' vision a reality. It was my dream job and even though it often involved long hours and extensive (if not always harmonious) telephone exchanges, I enjoyed every minute of it. I learned so much from Ellis and my Galaxy colleagues during those years and will always consider them as some of the most exciting and rewarding of my career. We opened our first Galaxy theatre in Sault Ste. Marie in 2000 and the rest is history. In 2003, Galaxy merged with Cineplex Odeon and I had the pleasure of working with the Robs - Wales and Cousins - for whom I have enormous respect and admiration. In 2005, Cineplex Galaxy acquired Famous Players and the Cineplex Entertainment Film Department entered a new era headed by the incomparable Michael Kennedy. What a great ride!

In addition to being blessed with a loving and supportive family – my husband Rob, my children Gillian, Evan and Shayne, and four amazing grandchildren - I am so fortunate to have had the opportunity to work in this remarkable industry for more than 25 years and to have made so many lasting friendships. It doesn't get much better than that.

As Vice President of Sales, Walt Disney Studios Motion Pictures Canada, Anthony Macina oversees the theatrical distribution of all Walt Disney Studios films in the Canadian market, including titles from Disney, Disneynature, Pixar, Marvel, Lucasfilm, and Touchstone. Most recently, Anthony handled the distribution of hit films such as Marvel's Avengers: Age of Ultron and Marvel's Ant-Man, Disney-Pixar's Inside Out, and Disney's Cinderella. One of the first releases he worked on at Disney was Touchstone's Pretty Woman, and over the years he has handled sales across Canada for hundreds of films, including all 15 Pixar releases, all four Pirates of the Caribbean, Marvel's The Avengers, and Disney's Frozen. Prior to joining Disney in 1990 as a branch manager, Anthony held sales manager positions at 20th Century Fox and MGM-United Artists. He is especially looking forward to Disney's upcoming release of Star Wars: The Force Awakens in December, having worked on the distribution of Return of the Jedi during his tenure at Fox.

Over the course of 36 years in the industry, Anthony has developed strong business relationships and friendships with members of the Canadian exhibition community and the Canadian Picture Pioneers. Anthony's career in the entertainment industry began in 1979, after a life-altering conversation with his father about packing his suitcases and the high cost of rent. The Toronto native abandoned his original plans to grow out his "fro" and become a rock star and accepted a job as a film shipper at Astral Films, where he believes he quickly impressed his employers with his shipping acumen. Six months after he began working, Astral handed over its shipping responsibilities to Victoria Film Services, which fortunately asked him to stay on and offered him a sales position in the film programming department. He quickly accepted; it was not only an exciting opportunity for him but, more importantly, he was already smitten with the beautiful billing clerk, his future wife Cindy. He and his wife have been married for 33 years and they have four grown children and two grandchildren. When not working or watching movies, Anthony spends his time playing music and traveling.

Remembering...

Gerald Dillon



Gerry started in the motion picture industry at the Imperial Theatre, Ottawa in 1945. Within the short span of five years, he went on to manage both indoor and drive-in theatres in Ottawa, Chatham, Peterborough and Toronto.

He joined Famous Players, Theatre Confections Ltd. (TCL) in 1951 as Supervisor of drive-ins concession operations, arenas and Parks. In 1962 he was appointed Branch Manager of the Montreal Branch of TCL, responsible for theatres in the Quebec, Eastern Ontario and the Maritimes.

In 1964, Gerry returned to Toronto to fill the newly created position of Eastern Division manager of TCL. In 1970 he was appointed to Vice President and General Manager of TCL.

No matter what endeavor Gerry undertook it was with energy and enthusiasm that virtually guaranteed

success. As a member of the Board of Directors of the National Association of Concessionaires from 1970 to 1975, he was instrumental in arranging and organizing numerous conventions and merchandising seminars to promote increased confection sales in theatres and drive-ins.

This same energy and organizational ability was also a windfall to the Canadian Picture Pioneers. Over many years, Gerry and his staff at Theatre Confections was a mainstay of the Annual Pioneers' Golf Tournament. The traditional "booty bags" and the host of prizes they solicited from suppliers greatly added to the success of the event. Gerry and the TCL staff helped with many other Pioneer evens throughout the years.

Soon after becoming a member of the Canadian Picture Pioneers' National Board of Directors, Gerry served as Secretary-Treasurer for four years and was elected President in 1977. His term as President brought about a substantial increase in the Trust Fund and considerably broadened its benefits to Pioneers in need.

Gerry spent most all of this career at Famous Players' Theatre Confections Ltd. and was a long serving active Canadian Picture Pioneers member. The Pioneers awarded him a Special Ancillary Award in 1973 and honoured him as Pioneer of the Year in 1979. Gerry retired in 1992 and continued to support the Pioneers for many years.

Remembering...

Orval Fruitman



Though only sixteen years of age when he answered an ad to secure employment at 20th Century Fox as a film reviser, Orval Fruitman knew immediately that the movie industry was where he belonged.

He soon moved to Columbia Pictures as a shipper and worked his way up to film booking. Orval then moved to Montreal to become the office manager in Columbia's office. While working in Montreal he moved over to Empire-Universal and soon returned to Toronto with that company. Orval then worked for Jack Bernstein at Allied Artists and then joined Cinepix Inc. where he worked for twelve years.

In 1979, he was appointed Vice President and General Manager of Pan Canadian Film Distribution working with Nat Taylor and Garth Drabinsky. After 10 years at Pan Canadian Film he was appointed

President of Brightstar Distribution acquiring over forty films for distribution and serving as associate producer on feature films. Orval eventually established his own distribution company, Bayview Films Distribution and continued developing and distributing product until his retirement.

Orval joined the Canadian Picture Pioneers in 1976. In 1979, he was elected President and served for two years. In 1981, he was honoured with a Special Pioneer Ancillary Award. During his long membership with the Pioneers, he has been a tireless fundraiser with the establishment of the "Sunday Drive-In Screenings" programme across Canada. He did this at a time when regular Sunday shows were prohibited by law in many communities. This project rose over \$100,000 for the Trust Fund. As publisher of the 50th Anniversary Canadian Picture Pioneers Awards Dinner book, Orval helped to raise \$60,000 for the Trust Fund. Orval served on the Picture Pioneer 1978 committee for Nat Taylor's 60th Anniversary and on the 1980 Pioneer of the Year Dinner for George Destounis. In 1999, the Pioneers honoured Orval as Pioneer of the Year. Long after his retirement Orval continued to serve the Pioneers, attending events and board meetings to lend his wise advice.

Remembering...

Philip H. May



The May family moved to Wainwright from North Battleford and Phil's lifelong association with the Movie Theatre Industry began on April 1, 1946. His father purchased the "Elite" Theatre in Wainwright. Phil was 16 years old at the time and he assisted in the Elite as an usher.

Phil's first successful business venture was the dry cleaning business but the pull of the movie industry was too strong and he rejoined the theatre business in 1952 when the family built a 2nd theatre in Wainwright, the "Alma" Theatre, followed by the "Stardust" Drive-In in 1953.

Although Phil had many and varied business interests, the one constant business throughout his life was the Motion Picture Theatre business. Coincidentally with the growth and operation of May Theatres which Phil and his brother Chuck had taken over from their father, Phil and Chuck partnered with Hector Ross and Frank Kettner, of Theatre Agencies in Calgary, in 1965 to found a new Cinema Circuit which has gone

on to become Landmark Cinemas, Canada's 2nd largest Motion Picture Theatre company. Phil sold his interests in Landmark Cinemas in 2005 and Retired from the Management and Board of Directors of Landmark at that time.

May Theatres, which is now owned by Phil's sons Mike and Colin will celebrate its 70th birthday in 2016. September 5, 1955, was arguably the most significant day in Phil's life: that's the day, in Edgerton, Alberta, that he married Lois Tunney. You can't speak of Phil's life and not speak of Lois and the part that she played in it. She was his trusted, loyal and ever energetic advisor and partner, whether that was in life, business ventures, charitable causes, or any other aspect of Phil's life.

Phil also had many causes that he believed in and he and Lois worked tirelessly to benefit them: none more so than their Founding of the Friends of the Edmonton MS Society and the work that Dr. Ken Warn was conducting at the University of Alberta. Their tenacity and perseverance in the founding of the Society and its ongoing support over many years was something to behold.

Throughout his life, Phil was always his own man and you always knew what he believed in, stood for, liked and didn't like.

You may not have agreed with Phil's position but you never had to guess as to what it was.



"Gone with the Wind", "The Wizard of Oz", "Mr. Smith Goes to Washington", "Stagecoach" and "Gunga Din" opened in theatres.

In 1939 a group of movie industry executives gathered to remember the passing of a friend. Jack Cohn, one of the founding partners of Columbia Pictures, was concerned that it only seemed to be funerals that brought industry friends together. Motivated by this thought, Cohen and a group of industry peers started the Picture Pioneers Inc., an organization to bring people in the industry together for fellowship and friends willing to help each other out in time of need. In the beginning membership was restricted to only those who had been in the industry for 25 years.

Many of the original members had help to start the major studios in Hollywood. In the first year over 200 other industry members joined, including some Canadians, among them pioneer theatre exhibitor Oscar Hanson and John Fitzgibbons, who later became president of Famous Players. These men brought together their friends Clair Hague and Ray Lewis to work on forming a Canadian equivalent and by the end of 1940 ratified a charter forming The Canadian Picture Pioneers. In the beginning years,

it became obvious that the need for help would increase beyond what had been first contemplated, and that formal fundraising plans would have to be developed to meet such demands. An important first step in those plans would be to apply to the Canadian Income Tax Department to register what would become the Canadian Picture Pioneers Trust Fund as a qualified charity with the right to issue receipts for income tax purposes.

It took until 1947, but this all came together with the Trust Document that we still operate under today stating that; "The Canadian Picture Pioneers Trust Fund shall be used and operated exclusively as a charitable fund and not for the benefit or private gain or profit of any persons, or of the Pioneers and shall be used solely for the relief of needy, poor or indigent persons generally throughout Canada and more particularly for the relief of any needy, poor or indigent persons who have been or are employed or were a part of the motion picture industry, or any affiliated industry." From the beginning the Trustees struggled to build up a sustaining capital fund.

Each year, little by little, with the generous support of Pioneer members and supporting companies the fund has grown but the Pioneers still need your assistance. 
